Get Involved!

This is your neighbourhood, here are some jobs that need doing for it to work.

Kitchen Bitchin' - The kitchen always needs people to help - chopping veg, washing up or planning the meals. Sign up to the rota in the kitchen tent.

Odd jobs - The camp is run on a DIY basis; keep an eye out for practical jobs that need doing. You could fix a leaky marquee, help build a greywater system, or even make some furniture.

Facilitating meetings - we need a facilitator for every morning meeting; a neutral helper who guides the group through decision making. If you'd like to give it a go, speak up. You can always ask someone to help; you don't have to do it by yourself.

Forming Affinity Groups - affinity groups are small groups of people who are up for taking action together. We'd like people to meet and form affinity groups during the week. You could arrange a networking session, sort out a noticeboard system or form an affinity group with your mates or other folks you've met at the camp. We need **you** to make it happen.
